

Details of Current CMS Quality Activities and NCI



Measures identified by a formal workgroup annually; voluntary participation by states; Medicaid Office in each state approves their participation and determines which measures to report; Person-Reported Outcomes-Performance Measures (PRO-PM); **NCI currently approved as the only Long Term Services/Supports measure.** <u>https://www.medicaid.gov/medicaid/quality-of-care/downloads/performance-measurement/2020-adult-core-set.pdf</u>



Measures selected by CMS from data reported by states; voluntary participation by states; Medicaid Office in each state confirms participation to CMS; three pillars of reporting - **State Health System Performance, State Administrative Accountability, and Federal Administrative Accountability;** LTSS is currently a cost per person measure and a checkoff re: Does the State Use Experience of Care Survey? Includes **NCI as one of three options** (NCI, NCI-AD, CAHPS HCBS).




RFI HCBS Recommend ed Measure Set Measures identified by state 1915(c) waiver Operating Agencies; required reporting by states for each separate waiver (unless shared administration); Six statutory assurance areas for reporting (Administrative Authority, Level of Care, Qualified Providers, Service Plan, Health and Welfare, Financial Accountability); **NCI currently included as a confirming/supporting data source within several state** 1915(c) Waivers; <u>https://wms-mmdl.cms.gov/WMS/faces/portal.jsp</u>

Measures identified by a workgroup within CMS; Request for Information posted for public comment at this time; measures will be voluntary at launch; potentially will fill the gap in HCBS/LTSS measures for other CMS measurement activity (see above); currently framed by NQF HCBS Quality Domains; **NCI included in both base measure set and extended measure set;**

CMS LTSS Quality Activities- DEHPG Workgroup



- Began meeting with National Associations and State Agencies in 2019
- Began with exploration of new measurement system
- Recommended CMS consider complete review of 1915(c) Interim Guidance for Quality Management, including Waiver PM /EBR/372 reporting procedures

• Document structure:

- Intro / Background, purpose, content, organization, measure selection criteria, limitations, types of measures.
- Recommended measures organized by NQF domains,
- Core set / extended set of measures
- 47 distinct questions posed by CMS throughout the RFI
- Respondents not required to respond to all questions – can offer comment on selected, priority areas

• Considering Measure Selection Criteria

- Importance to measure and report
- Scientific Acceptability of Measure Properties
- Feasibility
- Usability and Use
- Related and Competing Measures
- Level at Which Measure Can Be Applied
- Type of Measure: process, structure or outcome

RFI Response Activity from State I/DD Systems

- NASDDDS Meeting To Gather Comments- Oct. 13
- CMS Focus groups to gather comments Sept. 30, Oct. 19 and NOV.16
- NASDDDS Draft Comments distributed to State I/DD Directors and QM Directors;
- State Agencies Submitting Comments Directly to CMS

Summary of Comments from NASDDDS Members

- General Comments
 - Must Undertake full review of HCBS Quality Management Requirements including 1915(c)
 - Any recommended measures must not exclusively add new measures on top of existing compliance measures
 - Transition from current structure of compliance measurement to outcome based measures must allow for transition time and take into account current Waiver Cycles
 - Infrastructure for reporting must be supported by federal partners
 - Must allow for customization and continued identification of priorities by individual states, and within individual HCBS programs
- Contents Specific Comments
 - CMS indicates measure participation is voluntary and should assure they remain voluntary and not become expectations in the future

Summary of Comments from NASDDDS Members cont..

- Contents Specific Comments
 - Criteria of most importance is usability/practical application of measures to drive improvement in state systems.
 - Proprietary measures/instruments such as NCI, when already consisting of major majority of states, is not a factor to rule out inclusion in acceptable measures
 - Recommend any work to develop standard set of measures be done in close partnership with state Medicaid and operating agencies
 - Involve advocates and people with lived experience in determining importance of measure
 - Ensure balance of measures covering process, structure and outcomes

Key points for NCI Coordinators

- Reliability/validity of NCI Data through implementation fidelity
 - Ensuring protocols are followed
 - Training adherence
 - Providing feedback to NCI
 - Annual work plan review
- Understanding of NCI team activities related to reliability/validity and measure development.
 - NQF submission
 - Testing of various modes
 - Robust revisions cycle
 - Annual work plan review
- NCI tested design protocols to ensure meaningful participation of people with IDD

Key points for NCI Coordinators (continued)

- Understanding NCI's flexibility and responsiveness to state needs
 - Ease of adding questions to reflect state priorities
 - State IDD agency role in establishing measures
- Discussing NCI with Quality Management Team in Operating Agency (OA) and State Medicaid Agency (SMA)
- Support NCI's role in current state Quality Management Structure
- Understanding the relationship between NCI, Medicaid Adult Core Measure Set, HCBS Waiver Performance Measures, RFI vision, and state's own quality measures
